- 1. Government: 3 Branches; Voting; Citizens; Free Born Males
- 2. Military: Professional; Phalanx; Chariots; Pyrrhic War
- 3. Economy: Stamped Coins (Silver); Central Markets
- 4. Religion: Polytheistic (Mythology); Same Gods (Different Names)
- 5. Entertainment Theater (Comedy & Tragedy); Chariots; Sports
- 6. Education: Alphabet; Epic Poems; Philosophy
- 7. Social Classes: Similar Lower Classes (Freedmen & Slaves)
