
About Ancient Egyptian Geography - The Nile River

The Nile River is the heart of Egypt.



- Nile River is 4,000 miles long (the longest river in the world!)
- Nile River flows North from central Africa to the Mediterranean sea.
- The Nile Delta is where the river splits into several channels before reaching the Mediterranean.
- The Nile flooded every year, leaving behind dark, rich soil that was good for farming. This area (in green on the map) was called the "Black land" for the color of the soil.
- The area beyond the Black lands were harsh deserts called the "Red lands."
